Enrollment after May 3rd increases to \$650.

If your child would like to stay for the afternoon, we will have programs offered by Launch Sports and Steam Coders from 1:00-3:00 P.M. They will sample the poems of some of the world's greatest poets and analyze meaning through the use of imagery, sound, meter, nuance, and word choice. This will help students become more astute readers and add to the sophistication of their writing and their world view as well.

Students will read from a variety of genres and texts to help them ease into more advanced reading found in 8th grade and high school. In addition to daily analysis, a focus on test taking strategies will also help students improve their standardized test scores in reading, in-class assessment, and high-school entrance and placement tests. Possessing a strong reading foundation and a comfort level with literary terms and analysis will prepare students for 8th grade and ensure academic achievement into the future.

**This course fulfills the summer school requirement for reading for incoming 8th grade students, and is open to entering 7th and 8th grade students who are ready for more advanced coursework.*

The before and after school Kids' Club program is open to all children who attend Saint Elizabeth Parish School Summer School. Kids Club is available from 7:00-8:00 A.M. and 12:00-6:00 P.M. during Summer School only. (Summer School and Kids' Club is closed for the 4th of July holiday)

Activities include water fun days, arts and crafts, outdoor recreation, other special activities. Students may participate in summer school and utilize day care. Pre-registration is required.

- Parents or authorized person(s) picking up the child must sign the child out using their assigned pin.
- School personnel may not sign students out. Students will only be released to an authorized adult.
- Entrance to the campus is through the main gate on Woodbury using the security access buzzer.
- Please mark personal items brought to school with student name, using a permanent marker.
- Please discourage your child from bringing any special or expensive toys; they may be lost or broken.
- **The school is not responsible for lost or damaged items.**

Important Information and Policies:

- 1) Session 1 summer school will run from June 17 – July 12 and there will be no school on July 4th. The program is for students entering Kindergarten to 8th grade in the fall. After the first week of summer school, classes will not be switched or changed.
- 2) The cost for Session 1 is \$600 and is due on Friday May 3rd – check should be made payable to Saint Elizabeth of Hungary Parish School. Registration costs includes all three classes, there are additional materials fees for some classes. There is NO tuition prorating for missed days. A late registration fee of \$50 will be applied to anyone registering after the May 3rd deadline.
- 3) A late registration fee of \$50 will be applied to anyone registering after the May 3rd deadline.
- 4) Friday, May 17th will be the last day to cancel a class; no refunds will be issued after this date. In previous years we have allowed classes to exceed class size to accommodate late registration, this will no longer be our policy. Please register in a timely manner as many classes are popular, and staff needs to plan accordingly.
